



Biomechanics Overview

During the 36 months of training, residents must complete a minimum of seventy five (75) complete biomechanical exams.

CPME has developed criteria as to what constitutes a COMPLETE biomechanical exam. The biomechanical exam must contain a patient complaint, an appropriate examination, a diagnosis and a treatment plan.

As an example, identifying a patient to have pes planus and referring the patient for orthotics does not meet the criteria for a complete biomechanical exam.

If you wish to use a specific form, and the sponsoring institution does not allow it to be placed in the hospital record, the resident might consider keeping a separate binder especially for these forms on file with the program director.
